

Canadian Slopestyle and Big Air 2024-2025 World Cup Spot Allocation

September 18th, 2024

Introduction

Freestyle Canada (FC) allocates World Cup (WC) starts to eligible members of national slopestyle and big air team into available FIS quotas based on the criteria in this document.

This document outlines the process for distribution of FIS World Cup competitive opportunities to athletes in the Canadian slopestyle and big air program for the 2024/25 season. Information on selection to the team, Committee structure, etc., can be found on the Freestyle Canada website.

Philosophy

FC works in partnership with Own the Podium to build and validate our performance plans that chart the path towards medals at the next and subsequent Olympic Winter Games. Funding from OTP and the Government of Canada is based on medal results from our athletes in the most recent Olympic Winter Games and the evidence that our athletes are trending towards medals in the subsequent Games. While Freestyle Canada's HP Committee would love to provide WC opportunities to all our skiers, available quota spots are limited, and we must give priority to those athletes who have the strongest evidence of medal potential in 2026.

Freestyle Canada will:

- Provide a transparent selection process for athletes eligible to compete in the events,
- Use a "rolling 12-month HPP calculation" to rank the skiers in each gender of the High Performance Program,
- Strive to balance opportunities for each athlete to improve his or her ranking,

FIS Quotas

Each FIS nation earns base quotas spots for World Cup events based primarily on athlete performances from the previous year. Additional spots may be provided by the FIS Race Director based on the FIS allocation system (found in section 2.3, here).

Eligibility

To be eligible for selection each athlete must:

- Sign the FIS Declaration stating compliance with all FIS rules of competition for the current season.
- Be in good standing with Freestyle Canada and be a member of the Slopestyle and Big Air HPP.
- Have a minimum of 50 FIS points in the appropriate discipline (Slopestyle or Big Air).

World Cup Selection Blocks

1. September 23rd: Chur BA,

2. October 7th: Stubai SS, Beijing

3. December 19th: Klagenfurt BA, Kreichberg BA, Laax SS, Aspen SS/BA, Stoneham SS,

4. February 6th: Tignes SS

FC World Cup Spot Selection Process

Athletes are selected on **HPP Rankings**, based on each athlete's best three event results over the previous 12 month period. The HP Committee is not required to fill all available FIS World Cup quota spots.

Additional factors considered are:

- 1. **Podium Potential**: Recent top finishes and ability to qualify for major events may be considered. Current top 12 WC results may be prioritized.
- 2. **Readiness**: Current fitness, health and training progress.
- 3. **Commitment**: Dedication to training and performance improvement. Commitment includes camp attendance, compliance and effort at camp/training, and other factors associated with excellence.

The HP Committee may also:

- Acknowledge, discuss and adjust ranking scores due to a significant competition anomaly that might have occurred and affect the ranking order.
- Consider an out of rank order selection when:
 - 1. there is a relatively narrow point spread in the HPP Ranking between two or more athletes,
 - 2. an athlete is returning from injury and there is any question about competition readiness.
 - 3. an athlete has had multiple WC opportunities but is not advancing towards top 12 WC results,
 - 4. an athlete is not attending training sessions or when present, has a poor attitude or poor training ethic,

Skill assessments may be used to compare competition readiness between two or more athletes. If used, a skill assessment will be undertaken in advance of the selection date and be based on observations at the most recent camps/competitions.

Selection and Decision Procedures

- 1. The HP Committee will select athletes for each opportunity and may also designate alternates.
- 2. Athletes under consideration will be informed of the decision by their coach. Selected athletes will be offered the opportunity and given the choice to accept or decline. The committee may establish a deadline for the athlete's decision.
- 3. If a selected athlete declines the offer and an alternate has been identified, the alternate may be offered the opportunity.
- 4. An opportunity may can be revoked if an athlete fails to maintain good standing with Freestyle Canada.

Exceptional Circumstances

An athlete who is progressing in their career but has a setback due to a health related circumstance may be afforded additional flexibility for HP Rankings and WC spot allocation; these situations are referred to as "Exceptional Circumstances".

The FC generated HPP Ranking score for each athlete based on the assumption that each athlete will have six available "starts" that will provide Placing data for the ranking. If an athlete is unable to achieve six starts in which they were qualified to compete, placing results can be brought forward from the previous period to total six.

To be considered for selection to a competition, athletes must be cleared for competition by the Freestyle Canada medical team.

- 1. The selection committee has the discretion to use the Exceptional Circumstance clause for special cases. This is more likely for athletes with a significant body of recent strong results (medals or top 6 at WC, major games or X-Games). This may include expanding the backwards extension of the selection period, or other adjustments to meet the special case.
- 2. Any injury must be evaluated and validated by a FC medical staff member.
- 3. The selection committee, with input from medical experts, may prevent an athlete from entering an event if the pace of the athlete's rehabilitation from injury warrants doing so.
- 4. It may occur that it is inappropriate for a High-Performance Program athlete, by reason of a health-related curtailment of activities, to participate in HPP training and competition activities for an entire program year. In such a situation, the following shall apply:

Other Situations

Issues not otherwise covered by this document are subject to the decision of the Chief Executive Officer of FC, in consultation with the Selection Committee.

Appeal and Hearing Process

FC is committed to upholding our organizational mission and adhering to the standards set by our performance partners. We strive to make decisions that align with these guidelines. If an athlete believes a mistake was made in applying these criteria, he or she should promptly reach out to their coach or the High Performance Director (HPD). If the issue remains unresolved after this discussion, the athlete may proceed with filing an appeal through the Freestyle Canada Appeal process.

Appendix 1 – Calculation of Slopestyle / Big Air HPP Rankings

Point Values are calculated using the athlete's final placings from eligible events. All competitions are factored based on the Tier and Value: see Appendix 3 for a sample Points Value Table.

The sum of an athletes three best point values, within a 12 month rolling selection period, will be calculated.

Ranking Criteria Notes:

A slopestyle or big air event can be determined to be of "neutral" (standard), "boosted" or "diminished" value.

- Neutral or standard events are those that meet the standards set out by the FIS. It is expected that all WC events meet these standards and will receive 100% of the calculation in the HP Ranking.
- A diminished value event results in a reduction of the FC internal ranking points available for the high performance rank by either 7.5% or 15% based on a variety of factors including a:
 - modified event format that allows for an easier "win",
 - below quality venue (small hits, missing features, etc.)
 - low quality field.
- "Boosted" events have been recognized in the past however, an event with a strong field on a difficult venue should now be worth 100%, though in an unusual circumstance, the HP Committee could deem an event boosted by 7.5 or 15%.
- Event values will usually be established before the event start to ensure an unbiased determination is made of the quality and value of the event.
- The selection committee reserves the right to determine that an event will not be recognized for ranking or selection purposes up to two weeks prior to the first training day
- Within two weeks after completion, an event will be valued and may be shifted into a different tier to accurately value the event.
- Value of events are determined as follows:
 - The HPP Selection Committee will determine the value of the Tier 1 events.
 - The HPAD advisory group will value the Tier 2 and 3 events.
 - These committees may decide to add eligible events with a minimum of two weeks' notice prior to the first competition day of that event.
