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INTRODUCTION TO THE CANADA CUP SERIES PRESENTED BY TOYO TIRES

The Canada Cup Series presented by Toyo Tires is our National Competition Circuit. It is designed primarily for athletes in the Learn & Train to Compete (L2C/T2C) stages of the Freestyle Canada Long Term Athlete Development (LTAD).

The purpose of Canada Cup Tour is as follows:

- To have a targeted, competitive, and sustainable <u>domestic</u> circuit that Freestyle Canada / P/TSO athletes can develop their competitive skills and coaches can create an effective yearly training plan around.
- To identify athletes transitioning to the High-Performance stream.
- To prepare athletes for the next level of international competition such as NorAm and other targeted international events.
- To design each event to its appropriate LTAD stage and develop the athletes effectively.
- To further support venue development (training venues) in our member programs.
- To create a national ranking system targeting all Canadian athletes, from the late T2T to T2C LTAD stages, for the following disciplines: Moguls/Dual Moguls, Aerials, Slopestyle/Big Air, and Halfpipe.
- To recognize the top ranked male and female athletes with an award, including NextGen team athletes, as Canada Cup Champions.

CANADA CUP AWARD GENERAL RULES

- All events will be sanctioned by Freestyle Canada under their current insurance policies and officiated as per Freestyle Canada's competition regulations.
- Eligible athletes will be awarded points as per their identified best

performances with the Competition Placing Values as per their discipline.

- Any athlete competing in the Canada Cup Series is eligible (including NextGen athletes). *National team World Cup athletes are ineligible for the Canada Cup ranking and the Toyo Cup.
- The male and female athletes with the highest cumulative points, based on the process below, will each be awarded the Canada Cup trophy within their discipline.
- 2024-25 Canada Cup champion will each be awarded a 2025-26 NorAm Tour spot for the 2025-2026 season of the discipline they won in.
- Canada Cup Awards will be given out at the end of the year, to the top Male and Top Female of each discipline.

CANADA CUP WORKING GROUP

Responsibilities

The Freestyle Canada High Performance Athlete Development Advisory Group (by discipline) will be responsible for the following tasks:

- Continuously assessing and developing this criterion. Freestyle Canada will select a few people within the association to work together to develop clear and accurate policies to operate a rankings program.
- FC's Event coordinator is responsible for managing the rankings.
- Review accuracy and relative factors of the ranking system on an ongoing basis.
- Communicate to the P/TSOs and coaches the criteria of the ranking system by November of each year.

Timelines

- Each Spring at the HPAD meeting, identify any potential changes in the Canada Cup Ranking procedures.
- November : Communicate the updated criteria for the upcoming season.
- The Rankings will be updated after each event throughout the season
